# Bridging the Al Governance Gaps in Southeast Asia: Future Collaboration with Japan

Dr. Lili Yan Ing is the Secretary General of the International Economic Association (IEA), a global institution dedicated to advancing economic research and addressing major policy challenges. She also serves as Lead Advisor for Southeast Asia at the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) and is a Distinguished Fellow of the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UN-SDSN).

From 2017 to 2019, Dr. Ing was Lead Advisor to the Minister of Trade of Indonesia, and from 2015 to 2017, Senior Advisor on Trade and Investment at the President's Office. During this period, Indonesia advanced key trade initiatives, including the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP), the Indonesia-Australia CEPA, the Indonesia-Korea CEPA, the Indonesia-EFTA CEPA, and reactivated negotiations on the Indonesia-EU CEPA. She also represented Indonesia at the G20 Trade Ministers Meeting and the WTO-OECD Trade Ministers Meeting in 2018.

Dr. Ing is widely published on trade, economic policy, AI, and digital governance. Her recent works include The New Global Economic Order (with Dani Rodrik), Robots and AI: A New Economic Era (with Gene Grossman), and Regional Integration and Non-Tariff Measures in ASEAN. She received the IEA Fellow Award in 2022.
